PASTOR'S CORNER

The Widow's Oil (1 kings 17:8-16)

There was a famine in Israel during the reign of Ahab and his wife, Jezebel. Elijah prophesied that there would be no rain in the land for three years (1 Kgs 17:1). The Lord made provision for Elijah by commanding the ravens to provide food for him and for him to drink from the brook. When the brook dried, the Lord ordered him to go to Zarephath, where a widow was prepared to feed till the famine was over.

Elijah remained with the widow all through the period of famine. It is interesting to note that:

1. God cares for his people no matter what life throws.
2. God did not give Elijah a full blueprint of how the three years of famine will be for him. However, as he remained faithful, God showed up for him each time there was a need he could not meet in his life.
3. God can use even the so-called helpless to meet needs. The widow needed help, and because God had prepared her, she allowed herself to be used to meet the need in the life of the man of God.
4. The same God cares for us if only we will remain faithful. God who worked the miracle of the oil and flour for Elijah and the widow of Zarephath is always available for you. May you receive the miracles you trust Him for in Jesus' name.
