PASTOR'S CORNER

Compassion During Crisis

1Sam. 30:11-12

In time of crisis, there is every tendency to close our bowl of mercy. David was in a crisis situation and on a journey to look for the Amalekites who had raided his camp in Ziklag. They found an Egyptian who was abandoned, sick and almost dead from hunger. He was given food and water and was revived.

The information that the Egyptian gave them was all that David needed to locate the Amalekites to recover not just what was taken from him but also other war booties. The lesson here is that in your dark moments, do not refuse to be merciful to others, you may not know how God will use a simple act of your kindness to cause a turnaround in your life and situation.

There are many sick, hungry and abandoned people all around us. A little act of kindness, a little act of compassion that you offer will change their situation for good. Are your eyes open enough to see the needs? You want God to bless you, you want God to help you recover lost grounds, open your eyes to the needs of others and do something about it.
